Lesson 53 of 81 (ages 3-6) / 47 of 75 (age 7+) · Digraphs & Blends · Ages 3-7+ · about 10 min

GOAL

Your child can blend the sounds to read:
chin, chop, chip, chat, much, such.

WHY IT MATTERS

Blending is reading: saying each sound and pushing them together until a word pops out. Every word your child will ever decode is built this way.

YOU'LL NEED

- The practice sheet for this lesson (worksheet.pdf) and a pencil or crayon.
- The lesson page on a phone or tablet, for the sounds and games.

LESSON FLOW about 10 minutes

1 min

Warm up

Quick flash of the last sounds: write "ch", "qu", "z" on paper, point, and your child says each sound.

SAY | "What sound is this? And this one?"

2 min

Listen

Tap each word on the lesson page and let your child hear it.

2 min

Show how

Point under each sound, say it, then sweep your finger along and say the word faster.

SAY | "ch... i... n... chin!"

2 min

Do it together

Your child reads the words on the practice sheet, then does the sound boxes. Then read the sentence: "Chip said, "I like to chop!"

2 min

Play

Play the sound boxes and hear-it-read-it games on the lesson page.

1 min

Wrap up

Let your child pick their favourite word and write it for the fridge.

SOUND BOXES

Say each word. Your child says one sound per box (or writes it).

#	SAY / SHOW	CHOICES	ANSWER	
1	"chin"	3 boxes	ch - i - n	☐
2	"chop"	3 boxes	ch - o - p	☐
3	"chip"	3 boxes	ch - i - p	☐
4	"chat"	3 boxes	ch - a - t	☐
5	"much"	3 boxes	m - u - ch	☐
6	"such"	3 boxes	s - u - ch	☐

WATCH FOR common mix-ups and what to do

Says each sound but can't join them.	-> Say the sounds again faster each time: c...a...t, c..a..t, cat. Keep the first sound going into the next.
Adds "uh" to sounds (cuh-a-tuh).	-> Clip the stop sounds short. "Tuh" can't blend into a word; /t/ can.
Guesses from the first letter.	-> Cover the word and uncover it one sound at a time so every sound gets said.

TOO HARD? MAKE IT EASIER

Blend out loud first: you say the sounds, your child says the word. Then move to reading.

TOO EASY? MAKE IT HARDER

Read the sentence and draw it: "Chip said, "I like to chop!"

HOW DID IT GO?

MY CHILD CAN...

- ☐ Reads at least 4 of: chin, chop, chip, chat, much, such.
- ☐ Blends without adding "uh" to the sounds.
