

New sound: s

Lesson 7 of 83 (ages 3-6) / 1 of 77 (age 7+) · SATPIN · Ages 3-7+ · about 10 min

GOAL

Your child can say /s/ when they see "s", and hear it in words like sun.

WHY IT MATTERS

Every letter sound is a building block. Once your child knows /s/, they can use it in every word it appears in: sat, sip, sun.

YOU'LL NEED

- The practice sheet for this lesson (worksheet.pdf) and a pencil or crayon.
- The lesson page on a phone or tablet, for the sounds and games.

LESSON FLOW about 10 minutes

1 min

Warm up

Play I spy with the sound: "I spy something that starts with /s/..."

2 min

Listen

Play /s/ on the lesson page three times. Your child watches your mouth and copies.

SAY

"This is /s/. Watch my mouth: teeth together, blow air through."

2 min

Show how

Show the letter "s" and the action: Weave your hand like a snake and say sssss. Then tap the words on the lesson page.

SAY

"When I see s, I say /s/. sun: /s/ sun!"

2 min

Do it together

Sound hunt: find 3 things at home with /s/. Then do the trace-and-write part of the practice sheet.

2 min

Play

Play the games on the lesson page: hear /s/ and tap its letters, then find where the sound is in a word.

1 min

Wrap up

Ask your child to teach the sound and action to someone else in the family.

SAY

"Can you show Grandma our new sound?"

HEAR IT, FIND IT

Say the sound (not the letter name). Your child points to the letters. Tick first-try answers.

#	SAY / SHOW	CHOICES	ANSWER	
1	Say /s/	s, a, t	s	☐

WATCH FOR common mix-ups and what to do

Says the sound too quickly to hear.

-> /s/ can be stretched: hold it like a long note, ssss, then let go.

Mixes up /s/ and /z/.

-> Same hissing mouth shape — /z/ just adds a buzz from your voice box.

TOO HARD? MAKE IT EASIER

Only do the listening parts today: hear it, say it, find it in pictures. Save the writing for tomorrow.

TOO EASY? MAKE IT HARDER

Ask your child to think of 5 words with the /s/ sound, and say where the sound is: start, middle or end.

HOW DID IT GO?

MY CHILD CAN...

- ☐ Says /s/ when shown "s".
- ☐ Hears /s/ in a word you say (sun).
- ☐ Writes "s" starting in the right place.
