

# New sound: t

Lesson 9 of 83 (ages 3-6) / 3 of 77 (age 7+) · SATPIN · Ages 3-7+ · about 10 min

**GOAL**

**Your child can say /t/ when they see "t", and hear it in words like tap.**

**WHY IT MATTERS**

Every letter sound is a building block. Once your child knows /t/, they can use it in every word it appears in: tap, tip, top.

**YOU'LL NEED**

- The practice sheet for this lesson (worksheet.pdf) and a pencil or crayon.
- The lesson page on a phone or tablet, for the sounds and games.

## LESSON FLOW about 10 minutes

1 min

**Warm up**

Quick flash of the last sounds: write "a", "s" on paper, point, and your child says each sound.

SAY | "What sound is this? And this one?"

2 min

**Listen**

Play /t/ on the lesson page three times. Your child watches your mouth and copies.

SAY | "This is /t/. Watch my mouth: tongue touches behind top teeth, quick puff."

2 min

**Show how**

Show the letter "t" and the action: Turn your head side to side like watching tennis and say t-t-t. Then tap the words on the lesson page.

SAY | "When I see t, I say /t/. tap: /t/ tap!"

2 min

**Do it together**

Sound hunt: find 3 things at home with /t/. Then do the trace-and-write part of the practice sheet.

2 min

**Play**

Play the games on the lesson page: hear /t/ and tap its letters, then find where the sound is in a word.

1 min

**Wrap up**

Ask your child to teach the sound and action to someone else in the family.

SAY | "Can you show Grandma our new sound?"

## HEAR IT, FIND IT

Say the sound (not the letter name). Your child points to the letters. Tick first-try answers.

| # | SAY / SHOW | CHOICES | ANSWER   |                          |
|---|------------|---------|----------|--------------------------|
| 1 | Say /t/    | t, a, s | <b>t</b> | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| 2 | Say /a/    | a, t, s | <b>a</b> | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| 3 | Say /s/    | s, t, a | <b>s</b> | <input type="checkbox"/> |

## WATCH FOR common mix-ups and what to do

Adds "uh" to the sound (tuh).

-> Keep it short and clipped: whisper it. /t/, not tuh. Extra "uh" makes blending harder.

Mixes up /t/ and /d/.

-> Same tongue tap behind your teeth — /d/ just adds a buzz from your voice box.

### TOO HARD? MAKE IT EASIER

Only do the listening parts today: hear it, say it, find it in pictures. Save the writing for tomorrow.

### TOO EASY? MAKE IT HARDER

Ask your child to think of 5 words with the /t/ sound, and say where the sound is: start, middle or end.

## HOW DID IT GO?

### MY CHILD CAN...

- ☐ Says /t/ when shown "t".
- ☐ Hears /t/ in a word you say (tap).
- ☐ Writes "t" starting in the right place.
