How to use this worksheet

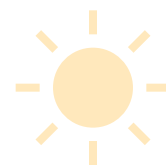
- 1 Cover the second word with a finger. Read the first word alone.
- 2 Cover the first word instead. Read the second word alone.
- 3 Say both words together, faster each time, until they blend into one.
- 4 Write the complete compound word on the blank line.

Example — this is what a correct answer looks like:

sun + flower -> sunflower

Tip

Every compound word here is two words your child already knows, just joined — the length is what looks intimidating, not the difficulty.

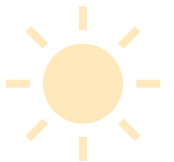

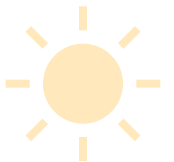

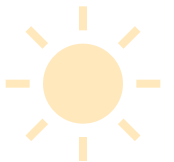
