How to use this worksheet

- 1 Read the rule at the top of the page.
- 2 Read the base word and the ending being added.
- 3 Write the correctly-spelled plural on the line — for Rule 3, remember to change the y to i first.
- 4 Check your spelling against the plural-rules-phonics guide once you're done.

Example — this is what a correct answer looks like:

cat + s -> cats

Tip

Teach the rules in order — Rule 1 covers most words, so it should feel automatic before Rules 2 and 3 (the exceptions) are introduced.



Rule 1 — Just Add -s

The default rule, covering most words.

cat + s -> _____

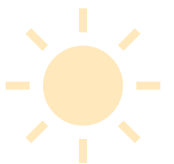
dog + s -> _____

Rule 2 — Add -es After s, x, z, ch, sh

These endings already hiss or buzz, so English adds a full extra syllable instead of just -s.

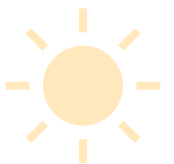

Rule 3 — Y to IES

When a consonant comes right before the y, change y to i and add -es.
