How to use this worksheet

- 1 Some words are split into two red chunks — say each chunk out loud, then blend them together into one word.
- 2 The silent letter is part of the spelling but doesn't get its own sound — don't try to say it separately.
- 3 Write the complete word on the blank line, including the silent letter.
- 4 Check your spelling against the printed word once you're done.

Example — this is what a correct answer looks like:

kn - **ee** -> knee

Master one pattern fully before starting the next — mixing several silent-letter patterns at once is where confusion creeps in.

K is silent before n at the start of a word.

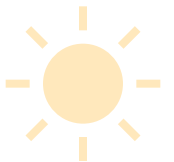

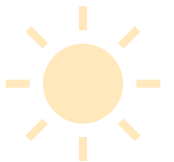

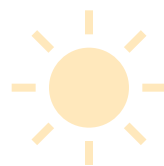
