

Suffix Spelling Rules — Apply the Rule

3 rules cover almost every -ing/-ed/-er spelling change. This worksheet gives one practice page per rule from the suffix-spelling-rules guide.

How to use this worksheet

- 1 Read the rule at the top of the page.
- 2 Read the base word and the suffix being added.
- 3 Write the correctly-spelled result on the line — remember to apply that page's rule (no change, double, or drop the e).
- 4 Check your spelling against the suffix-spelling-rules guide once you're done.

Example — this is what a correct answer looks like:

run + ing -> running

Tip

Do a quick word-sort after each page: mix a few results from all 3 rules and sort them into 'no change,' 'doubled,' and 'dropped the e' piles.



Rule 1 — Just Add It

Most words need no change at all before the suffix.

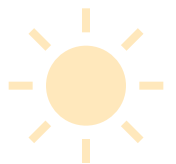
jump + ing -> _____

Rule 2 — Double the Final Consonant

One consonant, right after one short vowel — double it before adding the suffix.

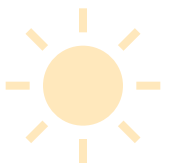
run + ing -> _____

Rule 3 — Drop the Silent E

Drop the e before adding -ing, -ed, or -er.

make + ing -> _____
