- 4 Ask a grown-up to check your answers against the key at the bottom of the page.

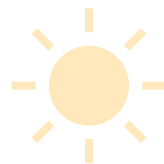
**Example — this is what a correct answer looks like:**

Do the 2 pages on separate days rather than back to back — 3 new categories at once is enough for one sitting.



# Sort: Closed, Open, Magic-E

Read each word in the word bank, then write it under its matching syllable type.

Word bank: bike cake cat fish go he home she stamp

**Magic-E**

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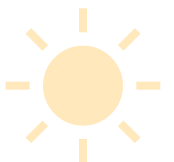
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Answer key (for the grown-up checking): Closed = cat, fish, stamp; Open = he, go, she; Magic-E = cake, bike, home



# Sort: Vowel Team, R-Controlled, Consonant+le

Read each word in the word bank, then write it under its matching syllable type.

Word bank: beat   bird   boat   bub·ble   car   nurse   rain   ta·ble   tur·tle

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Answer key (for the grown-up checking): Vowel Team = rain, beat, boat; R-Controlled = car, bird, nurse; Consonant+le = ta·ble, bub·ble, tur·tle
